Album description:

This album dates from around 1914-1916 and has been identified as depicting the family of Lieut-Colonel Albert William Crawford McFall, Yorkshire Light Infantry. McFall's two daughters, Marian (b. February 1902) and Vera (b. March 1903) feature throughout the album, along with a lot of pets!

Sarah Spink (aka EastMarple1) has done some research and sent me this information: From Findmypast:

Albert was born on 19th Feb 1862 and baptised on 10th Sep 1862 at Rae Bareilly, India. Parents David Chambers McFall and his wife Abigail. An older brother, born 2 years before, was also baptised at the same time:- Chambers Haldane Coole McFall (think I have read his name correctly..). Their father David was assist surgeon with HM 34th Regiment.

He married Annie Peter in qtr 4 1897, Kensington Registration District His death was registered qtr 2 1923, Blandford District (covers Winterbourne Zelston). Age

61 years.

Lieut-Colonel Albert William Crawford McFall, late Yorkshire Light Infantry, of Zelstone Manor, who died on May 11th, intestate, has left £70 0s. 11d. Letters of administration are granted to the widow. Colonel McFall was a stepson of Mme Sarah Grand, the novelist, who is Mayoress of Bath.

"The Westminster Gazette" announces the death of Lieut-Colonel Crawford McFall, who joined the Yorkshire Light Infantry in 1883 and was in the Zhob and Kideral expedition. He served in the Boer War and did good work with the Royal Air Force in the late war. Madam Sarah Grand, the novelist, who is Mayoress of Bath, is his stepmother.

This also adds that in one expedition in Africa he was aide de camp to General Sir George White of Ladysmith.

He was overage for active service in WWI but "did splendid work in recruiting"
He was buried in Wimborne Cemetery after a service at Winterbourne Zelston. Mayoress couldn't attend - duties to attend to.....

Note he wrote and illustrated a book "With The Zhob Field Force" in the mid 1890s. At time of 1881 census, when age just 19 years, he was visiting a GP in Norwich. Albert's occupation is given as Surgeon. General. (Bit young for that!)

Miss Marian McFall and Miss Vera McFall are mentioned as bridesmaids at a military wedding in St Margaret's, Westminster in January 1912.
