

PARISH MAGAZINE.

The event of the summer has been the erection of the Pavilion. For it the club has many friends to thank. Mrs. Palmes gave the first hope last year when she offered a donation of £5. Then a couple of months ago Lady Dunsany made a most generous gift of the main timbers and other material-it was this that placed the building of the Pavilion within the club's means. Other ladies and gentlemen helped, and the amount of their gifts will appear in the cricket accounts for the year. The important fact is that the Pavilion is in its place, and that its appearance reflects great credit on those who designed and built it.

Curiously enough on the first Saturday that the Pavilion was put into use every member of the opposing eleven came in ordinary clothes and changed into flannels for the game.

For some reason or other the club cannot manage to win many of its matches. The games are very friendly and pleasant, and so the main object of playing cricket is gained. We get our opponents out for very few runs as a rule, but more times than not we fail to score as many ourselves. Cricket is known as a game of "glorious uncertainty," in that lies its charm. Let us hope that in the return matches the luck will change.

There will be matches at Bere Regis on August 3rd, 8th, 15th, 29th, and on September 5th and 12th. On these days the ground is open, in spite of the notices, to all who care to watch the play.
