E begin our notes this month by referring to one important date. On Sunday, February 28th, we ask for really generous collections in church towards the World Refugee Appeal. When we think of the many, many thousands of men, women and children who are quite homeless and often living in a foreign

country on the minimum of food we must do all we can to help those who are giving help to these people. That is the cause for this Appeal. We here have so many comforts and pleasures and it must be met with real generosity. Please do your very best to give on that Sunday and if unable to attend church donations will

gladly be received by the Vicar or Churchwardens.

In support of this Appeal many homes in the Parish will be called upon to make a contribution during the week commencing February 29th. The committee arranging this collection has also arranged a Fayre to be held in the Drax Hall on Saturday, March 5th, opening at 3 p.m. when every organisation in the Parish will be represented and this will be followed by a Bingo tournament. Full details will appear on posters. We quote the following message from Her Majesty the Queen which was addressed to the United Kingdom Committee of World Refugee Appeal—

'We who know the comfort and security of family life must feel real concern for our fellow men and women who now live in poverty and distress. As Patron of the Committee I am confident that my people will respond generously to the appeal which you are making'.

At Winterbourne Kingston arrangements have been made by the Parish Council to include a Bring and Buy sale and also a house to house collection. We feel sure that this will be met with a generous response.

A SH Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is on March 2nd. There will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 9 a.m. and Evening Service at 7 p.m. For many years past we have had a Lenten Service each Thursday, and last year we changed the time to 3 p.m. instead of the evening.
