My dear Friends,

'CALLED TO BE SAINTS' - Romans 1: 7.

I suppose that very few of us would claim to be saints. By saints most of us mean especially holy people, living dedicated lives on a higher plane of existance than we could hope to reach. We think of St. Francis, of St. John of the Cross and of St. Teresa and certainly such people have left us such an example that we can only marvel in all humility.

Yet in his Letter to the Romans, St. Paul is evidently addressing all members of the young Christian Church in Rome who, he tells them, are all called to be saints. Has this then any relevance for us? I believe that it has. At our baptism we are marked with the insignia of the Cross and are, in fact, dedicated to fight for Christ under that banner and to remain his faithful soldiers and servants to the end of our lives. So, in common with all other Christian men and women we are called to be saints—those whose whole lives are spent in the glad service of their Lord. Very few of us live up to this high calling it is true, but we should never forget that this is the significance of being marked with our Lord's special sign.

On November 1st. we celebrate All Saints Day which is a Feast set apart for honouring those countless un-named saints who have lived holy lives in their generation and pointed many a 'fearful saint' to a greater knowledge and love of God.

Would it not be entirely appropriate if we were all to use All Saints Tide as a time of re-dedication? There is a celebration of Holy Communion in St. Laurence, Affpuddle at 9.30 a.m. on the day itself if you are able to attend but, in any case, let us resolve to recollect our sacred calling and endeavour to heed it.
