My dear Friends,

The time that I have spent with you has been an enriching time for me. I have received from you all true Christian friendship which has made my short ministry with you a time of joy. I feel I have been enlarged by your fellowship and the happiness of worshipping with you. I am certain God has much to give you in the future and pray that your new Rector will lead you into a fullter and greater truth. We have been praying together for him and his family. Please continue to do this. Few things are more important to a parish priest than the prayerful support of his parish. My time with you ends at the last week in June. From 7th July I am going to help with the parishes of south Tarrants - Keynston, Rushton and Monkton When their new Rector is instituted I then hope to have a holiday for my wife and I have become somewhat involved with parish duties and we both need a change.

I have been recently reading again the Acts of the Apostles. The second half - chapter 13 onwards - traces the spread of the Christian faith into the Gentile (non-Jewish) world. We read of the sending of Paul and Barnabas, 13 v.1-3 and the start of their first missionary journey vv.4-13, but we should remember the quality of the church they leave behind them and which sends them forth.

The <u>church</u> at Antioch v.1 was clearly distinguished from the rest of the city dwellers - just as the assembly today must be different from the world around it.

It was a gifted society. It was edified - it walked in the fear of the Lord and ain the empowering by Holy Spirit it was multiplied, 9 v.31. Here (13 v.1) we find its human source was 'prophets and teachers' the prophet spoke the word of God and the teacher explained it. God provided gifted instructors to build up his church - do we recognise and respect these gifts in our communities. Among them was a Levite, a black man, a North African, a nobleman and a Pharisee. Such distinctions of race and colour, social class and education enrich a fellowship enjoying oneness in Jesus Christ. Further the church recognises the liberty of the Holy Spirit to guide its affairs, vv.2-3. The Holy Spirit speaks v.2, send v.4, and strengthens v.9. Only as a church community allows them freedom will there be real progress.

This is my prayer and wish for you all - the church of God at Bere Regis and Affpuddle.

- 6. Grease a baking tray and cook for 20 25 minutes at 160°
