

PEACE and QUIET and STILLNESS

There is a loose-leaf "visitors book" in Bere Regis church, and hundreds of visitors sign it during the year. Affpuddle now has a very smart new visitors book and a smaller number of sign this, but for some reason those visiting Affpuddle seem to write mini essays in the remarks column. The Bere Regis visitors confine themselves to one word - "beautiful" or "fantastic". And the most common expression is "Peaceful" or "Quiet". Visitors often sit still for quite a long time, soaking up the peace and quiet in both churches.

It's not surprising. Even in Dorset, there is a constant noise, mostly from engines and machinery. Young people like noise. Its a sort of virility symbol, like speed. But as we get older we don't like it quite so much.

There is an old word for it, "Pandemonium". It means "devilish". It is the noise of Hell. It weakens, disintegrates and finally destroys what is human. It is an enemy of physical and mental health.

In view of this, it is worth reflecting on the peace and silence of Jesus. He continually took himself off and away from people into the stillness of lonely places. In him, the busy and the demented found peace and calm. He practised stillness to such an extent that it became him. And then when the wild storms of sinful men beat upon him in the weeks before they killed him., his stillness held firm. He held his peace. He remained unmoved. Noisy people made rings round him and taunted him, but he had mastered stillness.

When the summer visitors have gone home, and the Autumn comes, perhaps we in our villages should spend a little time sitting in the peace and stillness of our church. To practice stillness is an activity which can do us nothing but good, and we can all do it

OBITUARIES

ELSIE SKINNER, aged 86

There was a full church for the funeral of Mrs Elsie Skinner on Tuesday 18th July, and it was lovely to be reminded of the history of a lady who was part of Bere Regis.

For example, there is a distinctive tree at the top of Woodbury Hill which can be seen from many parts of the village. That tree was very precious to Mrs Skinner because she grew up with it. On either side of the tree there used to be houses,homes - and that is where the Stickleys lived. Elsie was a Stickley. She was born on Woodbury Hill, one of seven children. Bere Regis was her world. She never wanted to travel. She was totally contented with her life. Like many others of her generation, she walked to school from Woodbury Hill to Shitterton where the girls of the village were taught. She left school at 13, and married at 19. She and Owen set up home, first in North Street, and then in West Street. This was to be her home for most of her life. They had four boys and one girl. To the deep distress and sadness of the family, her Owen died when she was only 45. They had celebrated their silver wedding, but she was left with the enormous problem of looking after her family alone. Janet was still at school, and three of the boys were doing National Service. It was 1953. Being a typical Dorset housewife, she battled on. She loved her home, she loved her garden. She was, again like many Dorset people, a quiet person who kept herself to herself.

As the years passed, grandchildren came and she loved them. She had eight grandchildren, and then as more years passed great grandchildren began to arrive, fourteen in all.

Sadly, the years began to take their toll, and old age dementia set in, which destroyed her ability to respon to her own precious family. The family expressed great gratitude for the care given to her at the Greenbushes Nursing Home in Dorchester.

We committed her to God in the church, and prayed that she may now rest in the peace and love of God.

EVELYN MARGARET HAFFENDEN, aged 87

Although having only lived in Bere Regis for the past seven years, Mrs Haffenden was quite well known because of her ability to join groups such as the Monday Club at Wool, the British Legion Ladies Wing and up to the time when she became too frail, the parish church.

She came from Kent, having been born in Dartford, and then spending her married life in the village of Otford. She and her husband, Frank, had no children

of their own, so Evelyn was able to offer her working life to the Southern Railway, and British Rail, working at the administrative offices at Nine Elms. Although retiring from the railways at 60, she managed to continue working full time with National Carriers until she was 69.

Otford was very much part of her life, and she left behind many close friends when she decided to come to be with her brother John James and his wife Eileen, and to live in Chalk Pit at Rye Hill. But she brought something rather precious from Otford. It was a railway station gas lamp and station sign. She and Frank had bought it, and it now brings light and pleasure to a corner of Bere Regis.

There was a large group at the Cremation in Poole, and "Aunt Ev" as she was called was bade farewell to by those who loved and cared for her to the end. May

she now rest in peace with her Lord.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL FOR DORSET

The Community Council for Dorset has appointed David Neilan as Rural Transport Advisor (RTA) to examine and promote community / voluntary transport in rural areas of Dorset. The new post is jointly funded by East Dorset, North Dorset, Purbeck, and West Dorset District Councils, Dorset Training and Enterprise Council, Dorset County Council and the Rural development commission. The RTA will work in co-operation with the Passenger Transport Group's Community Transport Officer.

"With the exception of housing, transport is felt to be the most crucial element in maintaining future balanced and viable rural communities". (Rural Transport

Problems RDC 1992).

By researching local transport needs especially for residents who do not own or have access to a car and / or live in communities that are poorly serviced by Public Transport, David will promote community transport initiatives and assist in co-ordinating local volunteers to meet specific local needs. This may mean matching needs to existing services eg. Country Cars, Dial-a-Ride, Hospital car schemes or by contacting bus operators to review bus routes / timetables. Where these solutions are not appropriate 'Community' based schemes can be suggested, enabling local solutions to be applied to local needs. To assist individuals,

communities, villages and parish councils the Rural Transport Adviser has three main functions.

- * To develop a database of voluntary / community based transport schemes in Dorset.
- * To disseminate information about rural transport issues, needs and good practise
- * To assist voluntary organisations to develop and run innovative transport schemes that meet local needs

The first stage is underway with a comprehensive survey of Parish Transport Reps, village and other voluntary organisations. The results of the survey will determine how to progress in stage 3. Information on rural transport issues will be produced in Community News and a regular Community Transport Newsletter. David is available to discuss specific rural transport issues with Parish and District Councils, village organisations and voluntary groups and individuals who are examining ways in which the quality and choice of rural transport in Dorset can be improved.

WEST DORSET MAGISTRATES' COURT OPEN DAY

County Hall, Dorchester

THE COURT IS OPEN ... Most law-abiding citizens never see the inside of a court-room. There is now a chance to do this - without risk! at the MAGISTRATES' COURT OPEN DAY at COUNTY HALL, DORCHESTER

on SATURDAY 7th October, 10.30am - 3.30pm.

Who are Magistrates? They come from all walks of life from our own community and are unpaid. In England and Wales there are 30,000 Magistrates - Justices of the Peace - who deal with 97% of all the criminal work which comes before the Courts; the remaining 3% (the very serious cases) are transferred to the Crown Court.

In Dorset there are 450 Magistrates, 45 of whom sit on the West Dorset Bench in Bridport, Dorchester and Sherborne Courts. In addition to the adult court work, young offenders are dealt with separately in the Youth Court, and the Family Court seals with parental contact and the care and maintenance of children. The Licensing Magistrates decide on licences for premises (pubs and shops etc) and extensions of licensing hours.

Magistrates have been serving the community since 1361. Women were first appointed to the Bench 75 years ago. Any adult can apply to become a Magistrate. Selection tries to ensure that the Bench is representative of the community, and

that magistrates are reasonable people of integrity. Appointment is made by the Lord Chancellor, and new Magistrates receive training which continues

throughout their service. In court, there is always a legally-qualified Clerk who will advise the Magistrates on matters of law, practice and procedure - but it is

the Magistrates who decide on guilt, and on sentence.

At Open day there will be mock trials in the Courtroom, exhibitions, presentations and videos. Magistrates, Clerks, Police, Probation Officers, the Crown Prosecution Service, Solicitors, Victim Support and Crime Prevention will all be there and happy to answer questions and to discuss their roles. IT'S FREE!-Drop in and see us on October 7th, 10.30am - 3.30pm at County Hall, Dorchester.

DO YOU HAVE A CHILD UNDER 5 YEARS OLD?

If so, this is for you - and them! The Play & Learn Van visits your area, travelling to over 30 rural communities around Dorchester, to bring activities for pre-school children aged 6 months to 5 years. These activities include reading and number games, colour and shape games, constructional toys, jigsaws, art activities, small PE equipment, sand and water toys, musical instruments, and lots of books. All these can be borrowed quite FREE OF CHARGE.

Helpful booklets for parents can be borrowed, and there are also many activity

sheets to help older children with letters, numbers etc.

Sue Harrison drives the van and, as a trained teacher of children in their early years, is able to give advice to parents on how to help their children during these important years. It has already ben proved that by coming to the Van regularly, children settle into school more easily and make a really confident start to work in the reception class.

The local schools recommend that all pre-school children use the Van if possible. Home visits are available for families who find difficulty in coming to

the scheduled stops, due to transport or other problems.

Fame and fortune favour the most worthy, and Bere Regis Cricket Club are no exception to the rule this hot season. Success is the new buzz word with even talk of promotion being bandied about. At home to lowly Holwell on a difficult pitch, Bere handed our a drubbing when home hopes had faltered, but Vasbert Green weighed in once more and superb match winner Dean Rogerson collected all the buffet with 5-7, a devastating spell. The second eleven did not fare so well at Frizzellians in the face of possibly the best attack in the division, but Pete 'Thommo' Thompson struck a fine 32 in a rich vein of form, rising up the batting order and in the popularity polls.

A very punishing schedule confronted the first eleven, all top four teams were next and every game was a cup final, and skipper Russell Hewitt sensed that his troops were ready for battle and everything kicked off at The Delph where veteran opener Doug Curtis sprinted to 29 with help from youth stars Graeme 'darling' Price and once again Dean Rogerson with an authoritative 48. Ten man Bradstone could not hope to reach 196, and early wickets from Bere's boys and fantasy fielding from Mark Bennett saw Bere home. Old enemies Stalbridge met Bere at home next, and an adequate total of 150 was reached with a patient 23 from steady campaigner Doug Curtis and his trusty Gray Nicholls. Pete Thompson struck again and business as usual continued as Alan Green took a vital three wickets, which was not to be the last time.

If someone had said that 450 runs was capable on the parched golden brown dust bowl of Plaintain Park at the BRACA, then it would have been hard to believe, as the seconds came within a whisker of winning a quite remarkable match in which the Stove burned brightly with a sparkling 90, bristling with power and strokeplay from the top drawer, but a fatal pull to the square leg boundary was the end of Bere's hopes.

The designated UN Safe Haven of Symene came under threat from Bere's big batting guns, and on an absolute minefield of a pitch on the slopes of Mt.. Just as with the corresponding fixture away to Parley, Bere and their army of fans were treated to a classic at home to the farmers and scythers of ye olde Ashmore. Turnstiles were spinning out of their sockets as a record gate was registered, and all the members were treated to a game slightly soured but one to cherish. Ashmore had a fearsome reputation for batting. A large total was uppermost, the Bear was lost early and it was left to Dean rogerson and Mark Bennett to consolidate who is showing signs of the best form of his epic career. With the magic 200 reached it was left to Ashmore's hitters, and hit they did, as only one wicket fell at 131. Bere struck with a ruthless efficiency, one wicket became three, then five, but Bere were never in command, they were on the ropes nine rounds out of ten and had played better and lost. As the night drew in,

everyone knew that wickets not overs were in the equation, and Bere's fielders never gave up the chase and hunted in packs, as 13 was needed Vasbert Green put Bere in the winners' enclosure with a deadly over. Afterwards ale flowed and with just three games left surely promotion beckons. The seconds fared not so well, but John 'Pink Panther' Denholm flourished in the middle for Bere with a Bradmanesque innings of 39.


