



AN UNCUT CAKE

Long before coming to these parishes, I went to a christening party. On the table was a beautifully iced cake. As so often happens, someone said "It seems a shame to cut it." Do you know, they never did! We looked at it, admired it and went home. No one had any. It was left, uncut.

Cakes, or hot crusty loaves, boxes of chocolates, cans of beer, Yorkshire pudding, - it spoils them to use them - but they are no good if you don't. Cakes are meant to be cut, bread to be sliced, cans to be opened. They are for sharing around.

I believe people are the same. We are to be shared. Some people say "I keep myself to myself." They don't want to get involved. The trouble with this is that they become like that uncut cake; neat, tidy, self-possessed. They give us nothing, we go away empty, and they don't nourish.

To be fair, it's not easy to share ourselves. Some people are very shy. We fear too much involvement. But if you think about it, we all owe a lot to those who share themselves; friends, people we have been to for help, colleagues, a teacher, and of course, members of the family.

When a man and woman comes into church to be married, they promise to share themselves in a most astonishing way. They put their lives in each others hands. They abandon their self-possession. They lose all privacy. And when babies come, they have to share themselves even more. They let themselves be taken over for years; broken nights, nappies, school, untidiness, anxiety; but also enormous pride and joy. But their life isn't their own. They've risked it on a relationship. Some don't. Some can't.

There is no doubt about it, love has it's risks and getting involved can be painful, but you can't have life without it. Cakes are for cutting, bread is for slicing, wine for drinking, and life is given us to share.

AN OBITUARY

MR SAMUEL DYER SMITH (Sam), aged 89 of Briantspuddle

With a sense of Thanksgiving for the life of Mr Sam Smith, a large congregation of relatives and friends filled the Affpuddle Church on the afternoon of 14th December.

There was of course deep sadness too, at the passing of a loving and much loved man, but the funeral service reflected the kindness and humour of one of the older villagers.

Sam Smith moved to Briantspuddle in 1952, aged 46. Before this, he had lived in Northamptonshire. Generations of blacksmiths in the family naturally led him to become one himself, but before the outbreak of the Second World War, he became an engineer for the local water works. This position he held, until attracted to the similar job with the pumping station at Briantspuddle.

He had married Babs on Guy Fawkes Day 1932, and they had four children, Judy (now in Tasmania), Malcolm, Sue and Lesley. So with a growing family, they moved to the village. Being a keen cricketer, Sam was picked for the Tolpuddle team, but had to retire a few years later when it was suggested that he needed a "runner"!

This involvement with the local scene was increased when he became a founder member of the Bladen Social Club, and became its Secretary.

On retirement, he sadly suffered several bouts of ill-health, and worst of all gradually became almost blind.

Three years ago, he and Babs celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary, surrounded by a large and loving family.

A churchman from birth, Sam enjoyed joining in the hymns, even when he couldn't read the words, so the singing of Crimond, together with the carol O Little Town of Bethlehem, and The Day Thou Gavest Lord Is Ended meant much to his many friends and to his family.

May he rest in the love of the God he had served for so many years.
