



Our Mission:

Amongst the pictures above my desk in the study in the Vicarage is that famous photograph of St Paul's Cathedral in the aftermath of a bombing raid on the city of London during the Blitz in World War II. All around St Paul's is smoke and debris and desolation yet amidst all the death and chaos the Cathedral remained open and lived up to the City of London's motto Resurgam – 'I rise again'. However I suspect that many of us would agree that the various actions and consequences in St Paul's Cathedral last month have not been the Church of England's finest hour. For some it typified the dithering of an institution that is seemingly out of touch with the realities of our everyday lives. But this I think is only partially accurate. It's easy of course with hindsight to level criticism and arguably the biggest mistake the Dean and Chapter of St Paul's made was to close its doors. To close a Church is to deny precisely what the Church exists for: to discover and renew our faith in God who created us in love and wants us to love one another through building his kingdom here in earth. A cathedral is the principal Church of

the Diocese and seeks to be all things to all people – to gather and to inspire and to be a place where God can be worshipped and his love made known; a place of unity and reconciliation. St Paul's Cathedral is an astonishing building – often described as Christopher Wren's 'masterpiece' built to replace the old cathedral destroyed in the Fire of London in 1666. It is the most distinctive church in the Country and the Commonwealth, a place of National celebration and thanksgiving and after the recent major refurbishment is a glittering depiction of Wren's genius. You may know the slender 'wobbly' millennium foot bridge from the Tate Modern gallery deliberately leads directly over the river Thames into the south side of St Paul's.


It has been hard to truly identify exactly what the Anti-Capitalist movement encamped in the Cathedrals precincts are seeking – there are many disparate messages. Some want to dissolve our present party political system of government but they have not said with what they would replace this. Others want to limit the power and influence of our banks and financial institutions and especially the money markets. More creatively, they have caused the Churches and the Government to start to question the systems we have and the society we are sustaining and living in. No doubt the recession has fuelled this. A material society in which an ever higher expectation of personal freedom seeminaly allows us to embrace whatever interests us without recognising the consequences on the young and old, the unemployed and the vulnerable amonast us. How does this exercising of our rights reflect our values and responsibilities and indeed our Christian faith? The announcement that the average increase in remuneration of directors of companies in the FTSE 100 had risen by over 90% in the past year has understandably reinforced some of the anti-capitalists' case and disillusioned so many people struggling on minimum incomes. But it is impractical to believe that any of us can live without the financial markets or that our commercial world somehow stands still. Our pensions and savings, our charities even our churches rely on some return on their investment, not to mention all businesses that must set aside sums from their profits for research and development and training and emergencies and to remain competitive and sustain employment and so on.

There is a certain irony that the wonderful refurbishments to St Paul's have been funded in part by the very institutions that are currently being criticised. Richard Charters the Bishop of London, and subsequently some politicians do recognise the failings of our financial systems and particularly the effect on the poor and fragile in our society. Indeed, one of the Cathedral's departments – the St Paul's Institute – has been working on improving relations between the Church and our financial institutions.

In a sense this whole issue is a reflection on how we live our lives; and the values we live by and it asks how do we balance the needs of the real world in which God places us with his expectations of us 'to act justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with God'?

Whilst there is much to do to resolve many differences – not least for the protesters

on our War Memorial, The Revd. Hugh Maddox, for leading the Service and Rose Butterfield for reading so beautifully.

As we all stood at the War Memorial, for the Ceremony of Remembrance, I wonder how many of us noticed the bells and realised what a difficult job the ringers have. Afterwards, I naively asked ringer, Jon Cleave "How did you ring six loud followed by six muffled chimes, before

the ceremony and then how did you 'strike' eleven – an odd number?"

This is what he said:

"We strap a leather pad on to one side of the clapper on each bell. It requires very grubby crawling around in the belfry the day before.

During ringing, it is difficult for the ringers, especially the less experienced ones, because it is more difficult to get the same interval between striking each bell."

But that's not all...

"Between stopping the muffled

ringing and striking 11 o'clock (because there is no clock at present), two of us have to get the muffle off the one bell we use to strike the hour, without upsetting any of the other five bells. Then get back into the ringing chamber, get our breath back, steady the nerves, do a BBC type count down and start the chosen bell swinging 1.5 seconds before 11.00, precisely. Then interrupt the swing between the 10th and 12th strikes. No pressure!"

Phew... I shall never take the Church Bells for granted again! Thank-you, ringers all!







Boundary Commission Review

In common with many districts across the country, Purbeck is currently undergoing a review of its district council election boundaries. One of the ideas currently put forward is that all Purbeck electoral wards will be represented by 3 district councillors. After discussion the parish council were not in favour of this option but learnt that it may be modified should the district council change its district council election process to what is known as an "all out" election. This would mean that all district councillors would be up for re-election once every 4 yours, as opposed to the current process of a third at a time every year.

Members agreed to write to the boundary commission to oppose the idea of 3 councillors per ward and to write to the chief executive of Purbeck district council supporting "all out" elections.

Hedge cutting

It is now the season for hedge cutting and it is an important practice for road safety as it maintains visibility at junctions, stops important safety road signs becoming obscured, and maintains the width of paths and roads.

Whilst it is necessary it also can result in a lot of debris being scattered across paths and roads which can be problematic. Modern day hedge cutters are often fitted with an attachment that mulches the cuttings and directs them to the base of the hedge, reducing debris. If these cannot be used the parish council hoped that those cutting hedges took what ever steps they could to minimise debris left behind.

Illegal Trial Bike Activity

Periodically the parish council receive complaints about illegal trial bike activity through forests within the parish. This is distinct from organised, legal activities that take place on private land. If residents become concerned about illegal bike activity and it is on land owned by the Forestry Commission, then please report it immediately through the Forestry Commission call centre on 0.845, 3673, 787.



"'Daisey, Daisey', Well done Ben!, and Figgy Duff."

When the English composer Harry Dacre (1860-1922) emigrated to the USA, he took with him his bike. Finding that Harry had to pay import duty, his friend commented that it was just as well he didn't bring a bicycle built for two as he would have had to pay twice the tax. Dacre was so taken with the phrase that he decided to make it into a song -Daisv Bell: A bicycle built for two. The sona achieved great popularity when sung in the music halls by Katie Lawrence, and the publisher sold the sheet music in the tens of thousands when published in 1892.

It has been said that the Daisy in the song refers to Daisy Greville, Countess of Warwick and mistress

I remember one wintry night a number of years ago now when I borrowed a mini car to travel from Saltcoats in Scotland to Rochdale in Lancashire. I was on a two week conference, but was anxious to spend the middle weekend with Janet – who was at home in Rochdale with the children. As I set



out – first down the M74 and then onto the M6, the weather became increasingly worse and night was drawing in fast. By the time I was driving through the Lake District making the long haul up hill near to Shap the rain was sheeting down and the tiny unprotected engine of the mini could take it no longer. It began to misfire and splutter and slowed down to a crawl – a mile or so on it gave one last gasp and died on me – just in time for me to roll onto the hard shoulder. The mountain and hill top peaks loomed menacingly above me as I sat alone in the car now surrounded by almost pitch black. This was before the advent of mobile phones so I was well and truly stuffed! Cars and HGV's thundered by, their lights ablaze seemingly unaware of the stricken mini – with its pathetic occupant quietly panicking inside! Surely this must be the most inhospitable place on earth! I don't think I have ever felt such a sense of isolation and helplessness.

Gathering my thoughts I remembered that I had passed a slip road about a mile back – maybe there would be signs of civilisation and help. So wrapping my self up against the wind and rain, and taking care to keep well on the inside of the hard shoulder, I began to walk back. After what seem like an age I reached the slip road, and still on the hard shoulder began to make my way towards what appeared to be a garage. Then the two beams of light shone straight at me! Was this an alien landing? Was I about to be abducted and whisked up to some distant galaxy? My overactive imagination collided with reality as a police officer walked towards me from his car with headlights full on. He looked startled! I realised I was wearing my clerical collar and it must have seemed strange to him on this wild and windswept night to see a totally bedraggled vicar walking

PURBECK DISTRICT COUNCIL REPORT

Council Tax

We are currently aiming for no (zero) increase in Council Tax for the coming year by utilising government grants to offset rises in our wage bill (subject to National pay scales). These limited grants are only available to us if we do



not increase Council Tax! As a result we have embarked upon a series of cost saving measures over the last year. I will write more on this in later reports as the final situation becomes clearer.

Boundary Commission

The Boundary Commission (BC) have informed Purbeck that they would like us to move to three member wards which would mean Bere Regis being incorporated into Wool or Wareham with three members being elected to represent the larger area. The BC have said they will only consider staying with the current one member wards (what we have at the moment) where we can demonstrate a pressing community need for single member representation. The Parish Council have sent a letter to the BC supporting the need to stay as we are with just one member. There will be an opportunity for consultation with the public when the BC announces their provisional findings early next year.

Gypsy & Traveller Sites



We are legally required to demonstrate that we have reviewed and planned for the needs of these communities as part of our overall housing and environmental responsibilities (sometimes called the Core Strategy). At a recent Council Meeting Councillors debated the issue and agreed to consult from 18 November 2011 until 10 February 2012 on the suitability of four possible sites. The shortlisted sites for consultation are (1 pitch = 1 caravan):

- County Farm, Burnham Lane/Washpond Lane, Swanage (2 pitches)
- Land off High Street, Herston Cross, Swanage (5 pitches)
- Land at Washpond Lane and Ulwell Road, Swanage (2 pitches)
- Land at Meadow View and Lancresse, East Burton Road, Wool (2 pitches)

Whilst none of these sites are near Bere Regis I still commend you to become involved. If we do not carry out a consultation, it makes the district more vulnerable and gives us little defence against unscrupulous planning applications in inappropriate areas. This consultation does not mean that the four sites put forward are suitable but it is an opportunity for you to give us your views on these sites plus any other suggestions you might have. The sites are heavily weighted in two areas so we are keen for people to come forward with suggestions for other sites in the district. This is the first stage of the consultation process on an extremely difficult subject. Please do have your say!

Two public exhibitions are to be held in Purbeck where people will be able to ask questions and have their say:

- Monday 21 November 3.30pm 7.30pm, The Mowlem, Shore Road, Swanage, Dorset, BH19 1DD
- Thursday 1 December 2.00pm 5.30pm, D'Urberville Centre, Colliers Lane, Wool, Dorset, BH20 6DL

The public consultation on sites suggested so far in Dorset will start on Friday 18 November 2011 and will last for 12 weeks. Questionnaires and leaflets will be available from council offices and libraries. There will be a series of public exhibitions across the county and information will also be available at www.dorsetforyou.com/travellerpitches where comments can also be made. We will consider the views of the public on the four sites put forward for consultation and any other suggested sites that may emerge through the consultation process. The Council will then undertake further public consultation to reach an agreement on the final plan before it is submitted to the government for inspection and approval.

Insulation Grants

Government grants which help insulate our homes are coming to an end very soon, possibly by the end of this year. The national scheme subsidises the cost of loft and cavity wall insulation. Under the scheme anybody over the age of 70 or on qualifying benefits and allowances can have cavity wall and loft insulation installed free of charge, subject to a survey. In order to make sure Purbeck residents take advantage of the funding, we have joined forces with the Dorset Energy Advice Centre (DEAC) to launch the "Countdown" campaign. We are







RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Turkey and Ham Pie

- 9oz button mushrooms
 - 2 1/2oz butter
- 1 1/2 oz flour
 1 1/2 oz flour
- 1pint turkey stock
- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- salt & pepper
- pinch grated nutmeg
- ◆ 1 lemon

- 11b turkey meat, cubed
- 11b ham, cubed
- 4fl. oz double cream
- pinch cayenne pepper
- ♦ 11b 2oz puff pastry
- legg
- ♦ 1tbl. spoon milk

Melt 11/2 oz butter in a heavy saucepan, stir in the flour and cook for 1 minute without browning,

Add a little of the stock. Then stir in the rest of the stock a little at the time to make a sauce, then add the onion. Season add nutmeg. Cook gently for about 20 minutes.

Melt the remaining butter in a frying pan and add the mushrooms, and a squeeze of lemon juice, stew gently for a few minutes then strain the juice into the sauce. Mix the mushrooms with the two meats. Add the cream to the sauce and reduce gently. Strain over the meats and return the mixture to the pan. Bring to the boil adding more lemon juice if needed and a pinch of cayenne, then pour into a shallow dish to chill..

Cut the pastry into two rounds, 11" and 12" in diameter, lay the smaller disk onto a large buttered and floured baking tray,brush the edge with beaten egg, then pile the turkey and ham mix onto the pastry, cover with the second piece of pastry, making sure that the edges are are firmly stuck, then crimp the edges with a fork. Glaze with the rest of the egg. Let the pie rest in the fridge for half an hour before baking in a fairly hot oven for about 40 minutes. serve hot with vegetables, or serve cold with salad.





### BERE REGIS AND DISTRICT TWINNING ASSOCIATION



- · Installation of the three new Purbeck stone "BERE REGIS" village signs, perhaps in May. These stones will carry an inscription saying
- "To commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen in 2012"
- · Jubilee Concert by Autumn Leaves in May
- $\cdot$  Sunday 3rd June Celebratory Jubilee Service in the Parish Church
- $\cdot$  Sunday 3rd June perhaps locally organised Street Parties in the afternoon
- · Monday 4th June Jubilee Pageant Parade through the village, followed by a Parish Picnic at the Sports Ground, with music and entertainment.

· Monday 4th June lighting the Jubilee Beacon. (possibly accompanied by fireworks, subject to consultation and funds)
